March Nutrition Month & Hunger Challenge!

Did you know that March is National Nutrition Month?

During March and April we will introduce "My Plate", a pilot nutrition education program designed by the USDA. The focus is to educate clients how to choose nutritionally sound foods in order to lead a healthy lifestyle.

IPM asks that all food drives in March and April feature the 4 main food categories: fruits, grains, vegetables and proteins. Monetary donations received during this time will be used to purchase these types of food.

Hunger Challenge: An anonymous contributor has pledged that for all food items and dollar contributions received in March and April, IPM will receive a challenge gift to support the "My Plate" program! That means the more items and funds donated, the more IPM will receive!

Ohioans are Food Insecure ! Overall 1 in 3 is qualified to receive food at one of the state's food pantries!

"Food insecurity" means food intake and eating patterns are disrupted by a lack of money or other resources. This holds true for IPM clients.

In a recent survey of 100 clients who visited our Choice Food Pantry within the last 6 months:

33% had to make a choice to pay for food or medical care every month

40% had to choose between paying for food or utilities every month
